

## Consecration with Expectation

**Oct 3 & 4:** Rosh Hashanah, the New Year

**Oct 3 – 12:** 10 Days of Awe Consecration and Evaluation

**Oct 12 –** The Day of Atonement, the debt is canceled

The first of the Fall Feasts on the Hebrew calendar is the Feast of Trumpets. Jews commonly refer to this feast as Rosh Hashanah, which literally means “head of the year.” It is the Jewish New Year’s Day, and is celebrated on the first two days of their month Tishri.

Rosh Hashanah is also the first of a ten-day period during which Jews enter into self-examination and repentance, known as the 10 Days of Awe, which conclude on Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. During this time, God, in a sense, withdraws His presence in order to create a hunger in the hearts of His people so that they will **abandon all else in pursuit of Him**. Needed every year for each year brings new challenges and obstacles?

It is on the Day of Atonement ' Yom kippur" that God commands **freedom, release and forgiveness of debts!**

And this Year of Jubilee is even more prophetic – remember: it was ushered in with a tetrad of four Red Blood Moons – a heavenly sign that will not occur in conjunction with the ordained feasts for another 500 years!

The Day of Atonement is October 12 – and it is the final day of a Year of Jubilee, which we will not witness for another 50 years.

All that God still intends for you in this season of celebration is about to be poured out!

1. A **DOUBLE** portion from the Lord (Joel 2:23) ... TWICE the power of every blessing!
2. **Financial** overflow (like the threshing floor of Joel 2:24)!
3. What you’ve lost – **RESTORED** (Joel 2:25)!
4. An explosion of **miracles** (“wondrously,” Jesus says in Joel 2:26)!

5. The divine presence of **Jesus** Himself! (Joel 2:27)
6. Increased **revelation** knowledge – with angels camped around your **children** (Joel 2:28)!
7. **DELIVERANCE** from whatever has blocked your victory (Joel 2:32)!
