¹³ And Israel said unto Joseph, Do not thy brethren feed the flock in Shechem? come, and I will send thee unto them. And he said to him, Here am I.

Joseph willingness to obey his Father's instruction begins a journey unbeknown to them both of great redemptive proportions: The process

²³ And it came to pass, when Joseph was come unto his brethren, that they stripped Joseph out of his coat, his coat of many colors that was on him;

Represented his papered life and preferred treatment (entitlement) and advantage over his brothers. He is forced to yield his rights. The process

²⁸ Then there passed by Midianites merchantmen; and they drew and lifted up Joseph out of the pit, and sold Joseph to the Ishmeelites for twenty pieces of silver: and they brought Joseph into Egypt.

Joseph is heading to unfamiliar territory and a place where his work schedule will increase and their will no preferred treatment: The Process

² And the Lord was with Joseph, and he was a prosperous man; and he was in the house of his master the Egyptian.

"prosperous?" God was with him through "The process" So far he is responding properly to his seemingly unfortunate circumstances

²⁰ And Joseph's master took him, and put him into the prison, a place where the king's prisoners were bound: and he was there in the prison.

²¹ But the LORD was with Joseph, and shewed him mercy, and gave him favor in the sight of the keeper of the prison.

Joseph is now betrayed by family and now by the ones he served. Though his hands are blessed they are bound in the natural again yet the adversary plan to bind him in the natural realm to make him to believe he is also bound in the spiritual realm. The process

²³ The keeper of the prison looked not to any thing that was under his hand; because the LORD was with him, and that which he did, the LORD made it to prosper.

The favor on his life is evident to all and his willingness to serve is causing him to grow greater in the spiritual real for here he finds out not only can

he have dreams but he can interpret.

²³ Yet did not the chief butler remember Joseph, but forgat him

⁵¹ And Joseph called the name of the firstborn Manasseh: For God, said he, hath made me forget all my toil, and all my father's house.

⁵² And the name of the second called he Ephraim: For God hath caused me to be fruitful in the land of my affliction.

**⁴ And Joseph said unto his
