## The Will to Love

1 Corinthians 13 Young's Literal Translation (YLT)

13 If with the tongues of men and of messengers I speak, and have not love, I have become brass sounding, or a cymbal tinkling;

Multiple languages even to angelic utterances unknown tongues in which you speak to God A sounding Gong or clanging symbols

Eros- carnal fleshly desire or attraction Philos- a brotherly love which stems from relationship and circumstances that bond

Agape - a sacrificial divine love not predicated on what is given in return

<sup>2</sup> and if I have prophecy, and know all the secrets, and all the knowledge, and if I have all the faith, so as to remove mountains, and have not love, I am nothing; <u>The great I Am says he would be nothing without that one attribute</u>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> and if I give away to feed others all my goods, and if I give up my body that I may be burned, and have not love, I am profited nothing. The great I Am says if had done all those things and did not Love I would have no return on my life. (talents no profit)

<sup>4</sup>The love is long-suffering, it is kind, Love can put itself in a state of denial or fulfillment and will wait though unjustly treated and still is kind. (how many people are known for kindness- <sup>7</sup> that He might show, in the ages that are coming, the exceeding riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus, Ephesians 2:7 Jesus demonstrated so powerfully!

## This is what it isn't

irritable

The love doth not envy ... Christ did not harbor feelings of discontented or resentful longing aroused by someone else's possessions, qualities, or fortune

the love doth not vaunt itself, ..... Boast; a vain display of what one is or has, or has done;

is not puffed up, ..... PRIDE- cannot see beyond own importance and opinion.

<sup>5</sup> doth not act unseemly, **not proper or appropriate**. Doth not seek its own things ... **full of self and every decision is about your well being** is not provoked ,.... **approachable, not quick to anger or** 

Doth not impute evil ... will not initiate or engage in something that would hurt the soul of an individual.

<sup>6</sup> rejoiceth not over the unrighteousness, wishes none should perish, does not relish in I told you so, is wearied by your plight of those outside of his care and covering.

## BACK TO WHAT HE IS

and rejoiceth with the truth;

- <sup>7</sup> all things it beareth, all it believeth, all it hopeth, all it endureth.
- <sup>8</sup> The love doth never fail; and whether [there be] prophecies, they shall become useless; whether tongues, they shall cease; whether knowledge, it shall become useless;
- <sup>9</sup> for in part we know, and in part we prophecy;
- <sup>10</sup> and when that which is perfect may come, then that which [is] in part shall become useless.
- When I was a babe, as a babe I was speaking, as a babe I was thinking, as a babe I was reasoning, and when I have become a man, I have made useless the things of the babe;
- <sup>12</sup> for we see now through a mirror obscurely, and then face to face; now I know in part, and then I shall fully know, as also I was known;
- <sup>13</sup> and now there doth remain faith, hope, love -- these three; and the greatest of these [is] love.
